Lay Chair Mutterings ...

It's the weather again!

More than a month ago, on Good Friday, in very inhospitable weather, some 150 folk trudged, following 3 crosses, up the road to the summit of Red Hill. In its natural amphitheatre a service was held, with sparkling Silver Band accompaniment and lowering skies, that reflected on the crucifixion of Jesus Christ.

Such an event has been replicated for centuries by thousands of Christians in cities, towns and villages across the globe and here, at Red Hill in the Wolds, is now approaching its 50 th year. The miserable greyness of the scene fitted the memory, recorded way back in history, when a bunch of Romans, having been egged on by baying mobs wanting 'blood', crucified Jesus on a rough cross that he had been forced to carry up a barren hillside. Remember, Pontius Pilate was the fat controller in a very volatile region, no change there, where life was still allowed to run by local religious laws provided it didn't conflict with Rome's objectives for the country. Pilate said he found no fault in Jesus, allowed a crowning with thorns, washed his hands of it all and consented to his death to keep the precarious peace.

What an ending. Are we out of our minds doing something like this, going to a service following crosses in the rain? Many think so. More was to come a couple of days later. The first Easter Weekend in history.

Easter Day was a miracle. DEATH DEFEATED. Resurrection happened. Jesus came back to life and, with that event came hope for all of us, of eternal life.

Remember, Jesus had said "Forgive them Father they do not know what they are doing". Believers live in hope that by following the principles for living as set out by Jesus; being forgiven for perpetually crucifying him; and, taking in his mindset and spirit into all that we are and do, we shall aspire to a place with God in eternity when this life ends. Are we out of our minds? Have billions down the ages also been out of their minds?

Try not to think CHURCH what a chequered history it has had! Start with the base line fact - the man Jesus Christ, and work from there.

By the time you read this, I hope Spring has blossomed into warm growing weather for our gardens and farms and that your personal journey through life, with friends, family and work mates continues to be loving, honest and open minded.

Minutes of Benniworth Parish Council Meeting held on Wednesday 21st February 2024 at Moor Farm by kind permission of Mrs Sue Olivant.

Public 10 Minutes 2 members of the public attended. Council was asked to consider purchasing a second defibrillator for the Horncastle end of the Village. It was agreed to consider this as an agenda item at the next meeting.

1. Apologies received from Cllr Rosie Chetwynd Talbot. Cllrs Susan McAllister and Phil Dyas on furlough.
2. Confirmation of Minutes of meeting held on 2nd November. Proposed by Cllr Chris Raynor and seconded by Cllr Ann South that they be signed.
3. Matter Arising

Bus Shelter roof – repairs are not urgent. A quote of £369 + VAT had been received being the maximum it would cost. It was agreed that Cllr Sue Olivant monitor and action repairs when necessary.

Churchyard – Cllr Ann South circulated a quote for grass cutting received from Andy Bond (Wolds Grass Cutting and Ground Care). Council was informed that The Church could pay £200 per year and that an anonymous donor has offered to contribute an annual donation of £200. It was agreed that the Parish Council would allocate £400 and that additional funds be obtained from fundraising/boon days. A second quotation to be obtained.

Overhanging Branches at Spring Bottom – Cllr Sue Olivant to ask K Wallis to resolve.

4. Planning Application West Barn – It was agreed Council had no observations
5. Future Format of Parish Council – Cllr Raynor reported on the information received from LALC regarding Council being inquorate or wanting to become a Village Committee. In the general discussion that followed it was agreed that Benniworth continue as a Parish Council but focus on encouraging interest, new

members and obtaining Secretarial support. Chair reported that Mrs Maria Watts had agreed to help with this as a consultant. Mrs Watts was thanked and asked to contribute to the discussion. Mrs Watts agreed to compose a job description for a secretary; compile a flyer with the aim of finding out what residents wanted from their Parish Council and obtain a second quote for grass cutting.

The date of the Village Public Meeting is to be Thursday 16th May at 7pm. The results from the flyer/survey to be obtained before this date. The AGM to be held on Wednesday 22 nd at 7pm. The venue for both meetings to be decided. Meeting closed at 8.30pm .

Benniworth Church

Benniworth Church - a view Until quite recently many people seemed to be enthusiastic about restoring Benniworth Church and maintaining it as a social centre as well as a place of worship. There were successful fund-raising events, some uplifting services and enjoyable social evenings held in the church. There is no village hall in Benniworth and it is up to us to try to keep this beautiful building for future generations to enjoy. Perhaps I am prejudiced in favour of having a social centre in the village because I grew up in Hainton and have very happy memories of attending educational and social events in Hainton Village hall. I still feel sad when I drive past the site of this building because it has been demolished and the land is now part of a grass field. Do we really want to see our church, which could continue to be a spiritual and social centre, demolished or made into a house? Why should we struggle to preserve this building when so few young people come to our church either to attend a service or to enjoy a concert? Could we make it more welcoming and interesting for them? I enjoy traditional hymns and services which many young people find boring. I suggested having a Spring Harvest style concert which is like a pop concert with a Christian message but this was not encouraged although I was willing to pay the band's expenses. I think it was another resident who suggested that we could hold dances in the church and mentioned 'boy meets girl' which may have offended some people, but why? They are going to meet up anyway and where better than in the caring environment of a social event in our church? There has been an appeal for volunteers to continue the wonderful work which has been done to keep the churchyard looking lovely. Many young people like to feel needed and useful so it could be worth approaching individuals and asking whether they are interested in helping. People can be reluctant to go to church because some church goers can be self-righteous, bigoted, critical of others, or unkind. Most of us try to recognize and overcome our weaknesses and become more loving, forgiving and tolerant. This can make a difference. When I stayed away from church to avoid conflict, I finally started attending church services again when I was welcomed into the church by sincere, kind people. Should we be raising money for a church building when so many people are in need? It is true that Jesus cared deeply about the poor but he loved the temple in Jerusalem and attended the synagogue near his home. I think He would approve of efforts to keep our church building as a place of worship and for pleasure. There is evidence in the Gospels that He had a sense of humour, went to parties and wanted us to be happy.

The refurbishment of the surface area will commence in early April. This includes moss treatment, pressure washing, binding and colour.

Memorial Plaque Presentation Service at Market Stainton

May 25th 2024 December 16th 1943 became known as 'Black Thursday'. A Bomber Command raid on Berlin started with 483 Lancasters and 15 Mosquitos but very poor weather conditions contributed to 23 Lancasters being shot down over the continent and another 17 returning with damage from enemy fighters or flak from the ground. Sadly, that wasn't the extent of the problems, as thick fog and very low cloud led to extremely poor visibility which caused many crews crash landing or running out of fuel. Two Lancasters were lost when they collided in mid air. Altogether, 43 aircraft were lost in crashes and many crew tragically died. 20 of the bombers which were on the raid were from 460 Squadron, including JB657 piloted by a 21 year old Flying Officer Archie Randall. JB657 sustained damage over Berlin before returning towards base at Binbrook. For 45 minutes it sought to land at Binbrook but crashed at Market Stainton, re-sulting in the death of all 7 of the crew. FO Randall's cousin, Dan Grant, has successfully applied for a plaque to be installed on the green at Market Stainton to honour the sacrifice made by this crew, and which will act as a reminder of the brave actions of so many people on behalf of this country. On Sunday May 25th there will be a memorial plaque presentation service on the green at Market Stainton. The ceremony will be attended by family members of the aircrew, Royal Air Force Association (Air Vice Marshal Nigel Bairsto) and a Royal British Legion standard party. There will also be a fly-past by the BBMF Lancaster, subject of course to weather and serviceability. The actual timings will be confirmed nearer to the day. Hopefully, these will be put on village and church noticeboards once they are known.

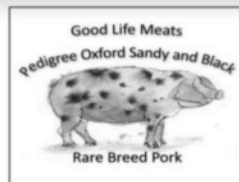
